

In their 2018 report, the British School Overseas inspection deemed Yasmina British Academy to be "Outstanding". The report highlighted the "Outstanding" provision from Early Years through to Sixth Form in quality of teaching, learning, and assessments, as well as leadership and management. Our Curriculum

The English National Curriculum is renowned and respected the world over as being one of the most academically rigorous pathways to further education. One of its key advantages is that it is constantly evolving to encompass the changing world in which we live. Above all, it is designed to foster a love of learning and at Yasmina, we aim to inspire and challenge our students to approach the curriculum with a sense of curiosity and resilience, ensuring that we instill these skills in them for life.

With passion at the heart of everything we do, Yasmina nurtures all children through a rich and exciting educational journey. We truly believe that all children can achieve academic success and live a life full of opportunity and fulfilment regardless of their starting point. High Performance Learning is based upon a framework that include 30 learning characteristics that students develop to be high performing learners. These are based around, 'How we think' and 'How we behave' and are embedded across our curriculum.

Successful foundations are laid in Early Years and in Primary to engage and cultivate awe, wonder, and imagination. Independence is developed and fostered through a safe environment where students feel comfortable taking risks and are not afraid to fail. Inclusive for all, barriers to learning are overcome through building trust to create confident, happy, reflective, and accountable learners, who make exceptional progress.

Our Early Years and Primary curriculum are designed to be exciting, varied, and creative, enabling learning to flow through the different subject areas. All students are given opportunities to make connections, apply their skills, and understand how their experiences relate to the real world. From these foundations, we are committed to delivering the highest levels of Arabic, Islamic and Social Studies in line with the expectations of the Ministry of Education.

Through the Middle School, our Year 5-8 teams bring together the best of Primary with the specialisms of Secondary in a creative, exciting curriculum fully preparing our students to successfully choose their I/GCSE options at the end of Year 8 until Year 11 and A Levels until Year 13.

GCSEs and A-levels are two of the most rigorous, reliable, and highly regarded examinations available. At the end of Year 13, students go on to study at some of the most prestigious universities around the world with our Alumni including graduates from Oxbridge, Ivy League, and Russell Group institutions.

Qualifications

I/GCSE

We recorded an impressive 56% 9 - 7 grades among all exams sat by its IGCSE students, while 95% of total entries earned 9 - 4 grades. In 2021, Yasmina recorded incredible achievements in the core subjects of English and Maths with 83% and 81% achieving grades of 9 - 6, in line with previous years.

A-Level

An incredible 77% of Yasmina British Academy's A-Level students scored A*, A or B, exceeding UK schools' benchmark of 53% and placing us in the top 5% of schools for value added. Top achieving students from Aldar Academies have already secured opportunities to pursue their higher education at prestigious Russell Group and Ivy League universities in the UK and USA.

i GCSE/GCSE Grades 2021/2022




High Performance Learning

Between October 2022 and June 2023, we have been incorporating the High-Performance Learning framework into how students learn at Yasmina British Academy. The HPL philosophy rests on decades of research around the intrinsic features of high performance, and the framework provides a clear strategy to develop students' cognitive and behavioural skills to enable high performance across the curriculum and prepare them for life beyond school. HPL focuses on our students' limitless potential, not fixed ability, which means every young person at Yasmina is given the opportunities and ingredients to succeed as a high performer.

The HPL framework includes 20 Advanced Cognitive Performance characteristics (ACPs) and 10 Values, Attitudes and Attributes (VAAs). These ACPs and VAAs are progressive and enable students to purposefully and consciously develop the thinking skills and behaviours required for high performance in all their lessons.

Attendance matters.

Good attendance is the foundation for academic achievement and it underpins all aspects of personal development. It establishes a responsible attitude towards the opportunities available in school and further education and it is the basis for the world of work. Attendance is a critical factor to a productive and successful school career.

Yasmina British Academy actively promotes and encourages 100% attendance for all pupils. Our aim is to ensure that students arrive at the academy and to lessons on time. We strive for attendance that is consistently outstanding for all year groups.

It is important that parents, students and the academy work together to improve and maintain high attendance and punctuality rates. Please contact the attendance officer (attendance@alyasminaacademy.sch.ae) and your child's class/form teacher if your child is absent.

A Home Learning

Learning at home is an essential part of good education as research shows that home learning has a positive impact on student outcomes. Home learning not only reinforces classroom learning, it also helps students to develop skills and attitudes they need for successful lifelong learning. Students need to be given opportunities to develop independence, habits of inquiry and investigation, time management and discipline which is essential for GCSE and A Level study.

Primary

Class Teachers will share Home Learning 'Take Away' sheets with the students at the beginning of each term. This will indicate the tasks that need to be completed for English, Maths, Science and STEAM over the term linking to the topic being taught.

In EYFS students are expected to read for 10 minutes every day and complete a practical activity linked to Maths, Arabic and Topic from the newsletter.

Students in Primary (Year 1 to Year 6) are expected to read for 15 minutes every day and learn the spelling rule in addition to the Takeaway homework sheet. Students record all home learning in their homework book. This allows for parents and class teachers to be able to monitor the work that is being completed. This helps students develop independence and time management skills as well as ensuring they make excellent progress in their learning.

Secondary

Heads of Year share Home Learning schedules for their year group at the start of the academic year, which specifies which subjects students need to work on each day.

As a general rule, students in Years 7, 8 and 9 are expected to complete 1.5 hours of home learning each day. When students progress on to GCSEs in Year 10 and 11, the expectation is for students to complete around 2 hours of independent learning at home each day. By the time students enter Post-16 and A level study, the demands of these courses mean students will have to complete around 3 hours of independent work on each subject, each week.

All students in Years 7-11 should spend 30-45 minutes of their daily home

learning time on reading, learning vocabulary, practising times tables and some form of review or consolidation of work completed in class.

Students record all home learning in their school planner so completion can be monitored by parents, tutors and teachers. This helps students develop independence and time management skills as well as ensuring they make excellent progress in their learning whilst remaining accountable to the adults who support them.

Technology enables innovative teaching and learning methods to be employed and to provide all students with the 21st century skills required in today's society.


The use of devices in school is carefully planned and monitored by staff and is used to enhance the learning experience. AYA operates a secure and closed network and the full details of safe use can be found when agreeing to the terms and conditions as part of the AYA MED BYOD Policy. All students from Year 1 to Year 13 will be trained at an age appropriate level how to integrate technology into their everyday learning.

It is essential to emphasise that your child's learning is the key focus around this initiative and there will still be a huge focus on active learning. Students will continue to learn away from their device and our highly skilled teaching staff will plan lessons very carefully to allow for this.

Our School Uniform

Aldar Academies' Uniform Policy

Our policy is based on the view that a school uniform:

- Promotes a sense of pride in the school
- Engenders a feeling of community and belonging
- Is practical and smart
- Identifies the students with their school
- Makes students feel equal to their peers in terms of appearance
- Has been designed with the health and safety of the students in mind
- Adheres to strict ADEK and government regulations.

School Bags

Students should bring a rucksack with two shoulder straps, Yasmina's school bags are encouraged, but optional.

School Shoes

Smart, black leather shoes with white socks must be worn. Please note that boots, sandals and trainers (except for PE) are not permitted.

Hair

Hair should be neat and tidy, with no extreme hair colouring or styles. Hair below collar length should be tied back or plaited. Only plain practical accessories may be worn in the school colours.

Jewellery

Students are permitted to wear a watch. Stud earrings may be worn. No other jewelry is permitted. In line with safe practices, earrings must be removed for PE and swimming lessons.

Cosmetics

Make-up, lipstick, nail varnish, nails extensions or temporary tattoos are not permitted in school.

Cultural Sensitivity

It is recognised that some parents of young girls would prefer that their arms and legs are fully covered. In such circumstances, second skins/in tshirts and leggings may be worn underneath uniforms, or trousers may by worn (obtainable tailor-made, from the uniform supplier).

*Leggings cannot be worn alone.

Post-16 Uniforms

The uniform for Post-16 students at Yasmina British Academy consists of our branded school uniform with a blue shirt or professional attire in black, white, blue or grey.

- Promote a stronger sense of identity and self-expression
- Foster a formal, professional, and mature environment
- Prepare students for the real world, such as university, internships, and the workplace

Parent & Guardian ID

Parent Passes will be used to further enhance our security procedures and should be worn whenever you are at school. You will be asked to show your Parent Pass when collecting your child or entering the premises. We encourage you to have it clearly on display.

If you do not have your Parent Pass, you will be asked to sign in as a visitor to obtain a visitor's pass.

In Primary, you must confirm your identity by supplying your child's unique PIN number also at collection time.

If you'd like your child to be collected by someone who does not have their own Parent Pass, please inform your class teacher via e-mail in advance with the details of who will be collecting your child.

The e-mail request will help staff to confirm that we have the authorisation to allow pick up for this adult. They will be asked to confirm your child's unique PIN also.

Parent Passes are compulsory and a key part of ensuring the safety of all children at school. These are arranged on Admission to our school and by our team at Reception: reception@yasminabritishacademy.ae.



General communication from the school will be uploaded onto the Parent Portal or through email. Primary class teachers will also communicate through our learning platform, Seesaw.

It is vital that you understand how to access the school Portal system as a parent as this is one of key forms of communication.

Nutrition & Catering

Early Years & Primary

Students must bring their own packed lunch and snacks to school daily, as well as their own water bottles. Water dispensers will be available should students need to re-fill.

In years 5 and 6, students have the option to purchase food from our mobile canteens at lunch time should they wish.

Note that we operate a nut free policy within Yasmina.

Secondary

Along with being able to bring their own packed lunch, we have partnered with Food Nation to open a canteen for Secondary students.

Food Nation prides itself on its commitment to providing honest, healthy and tasty food to students, and works across a wide range of schools in the Emirate.

The following options will be on offer daily:

- 1. Grab and Go Range = AED 2.00 to AED 15.00
- 2. Meal of the day (Protein with starch and side) = AED 15.00
- 3. Meal of the day (Protein with starch, sides and dessert) = AED 18.00
